SUBJECT: Hesco Armor, Inc., model 3610

The National Institute of Justice (NIJ) hereby advises the following Hesco Armor, Inc. ballistic-resistant body model 3610 have been permanently removed from the NIJ Compliant Products List due to unresolved safety concerns.

Any armors with this model designation should be replaced as soon as possible.

NIJ encourages law enforcement and corrections officers to continue to wear their body armor until it is replaced. Wearing armor that may have reduced effectiveness is better than not wearing any armor.
